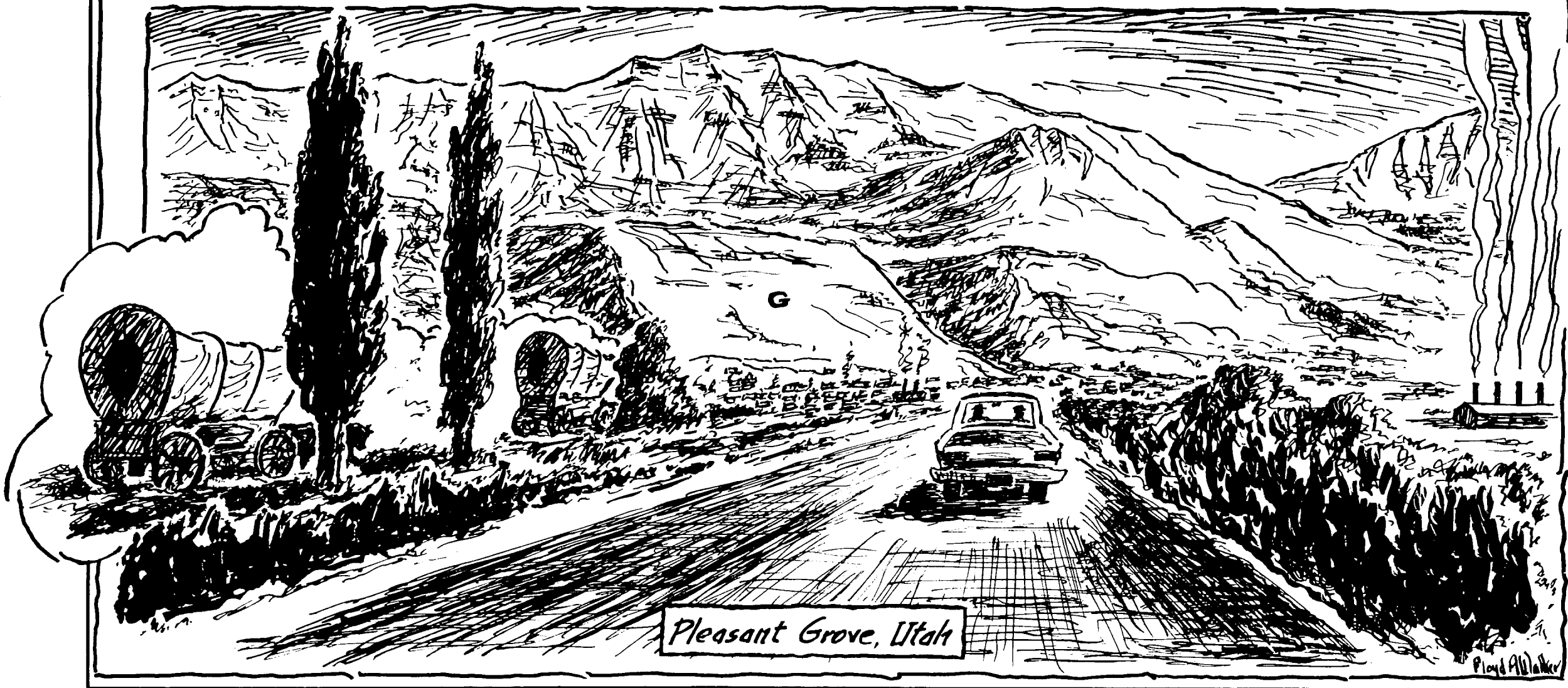

This Walker Book contains the genealogy and story of Henson Walker Jr., his progenitors and descendants.

For years it had been Jennie Walker Johnson's desire that her "L.D.S. Family Record--Henson Walker Family" be published so that it would be available for the family members to have in their individual homes. Sometime ago the genealogical data collected at that time was micro-filmed by the Genealogical Society in Salt Lake City, Utah.

A number of relatives have been interested in trying to help with research from time to time and have aided us. Finally, in the fall of 1957, Floyd A. Walker came to us a number of times showing considerable interest. He suggested the use of a loose-leaf binder, showed us the Christensen Book and made suggestions as to what might be done. We liked his proposals and decided to entrust publication of the Book to him.

At the time various family groups voiced their willingness to support this proposed effort.

After Jennie's death Jan. 4, 1958, the records were turned over to Floyd and he was instructed to proceed in his own way with the publication.

I want to express how deeply grateful I am for the opportunity of devoting six years to the publication of this book. Above all else, I soon came to respect the thing that I was doing. It was almost like gathering material from the "far-flung corners of the earth." It was indeed a challenge to assemble information from busy people into readable form---to attempt to "literally create ideas" into an acceptable record of our kin and forebears.

As I became involved in publication---the people themselves emerged. Yes, the subject matter became people and as well, an attendant fuller comprehension of this great work came to me. It pertained to life itself and the Divine Purpose. It had to do with little children, mother love and worthy fathers and an eternal relationship under a guiding Father. I found that people are much the same the world over. Wanting just a little understanding, giving of themselves for sharing loneliness and friendliness akin to starved love. As a consequence I can do no less than try to preserve what I feel prompted to suggest.

Through this I have come to truly love my people, more than I ever thought possible. May God help me and forgive me wherein I have failed to properly do them justice and that they will try to understand what I have tried to say and do.

As this great work for the living and the dead opened up more to my understanding, I have keenly sensed that our forefathers wanted not only their genealogy preserved but as well, something of their attitudes, their standards, their dreams, their aspirations and their testimonies-- --left as monuments for all who should come after, to read, to hear and

to understand. There was to be absolutely no misconception as to their positions - and if we truly have understanding hearts, eyes to see and ears to hear---we would know whereof they spoke---as if with "voices from the dust."

There has been a wonderful spirit about this work. Yes, I have felt close to our departed and living kinsmen. There has been sufficient of their prayers and their love to sustain me through the long hours and days alone, and in the dark when there was no sleep. My wife, Esther, was always close at hand or within calling or phoning distance. I shall always be grateful for the faith and understanding she has manifested, for her encouragement and love. It has made it easier for me to always feel justified in going to my Heavenly Father with all my problems and to keep going---even during the many times when I was so ill. I shall be eternally thankful for His sustaining love, comfort, guidance and for His inspiration in discerning when things were right. Truly the Lord has been my buckler and my shield.

With the variety of problems that constantly came and the many distractions, through prayer and steadfastness of purpose---there always seemed to be a way through. Just as if aided by unseen hands---did we have cause to persist. In fact I can truthfully say that we received "Light from many lamps." This phrase is title to a book compiled and edited by Lillian Eichler Watson - which has been a source of much help over these years. Most of all, constant study of our current Instructors, Era's, the Standard Works of the Church and books of commentary---have aided me in trying to keep in tune with Church doctrine and genealogical procedure.

Contemplation of this subject brings us to the realization that our ability--our capacity for gratitude and appreciation---is certainly something akin to the measurement of our growth and we begin to know how important it is. We are so much aware of the fact that our Church Leaders generally were just ordinary men, even as you and I. But by faithfulness and devotion to their calls, and through fasting and prayer and humility, their stature has enlarged and they are truly the Lord's chosen leaders. Jesus learned this lesson, "Though he were a Son, yet learned he obedience by the things which he suffered; and being made perfect, he became the author of eternal salvation unto all them that obey him." How devotedly He worshiped His Father! In the Garden of Gethsemane, said He, ". . . not my will, but thine, be done." (Luke 22:42).

Once again, let us be reminded--if we all have appreciation and love

for each other and the marvelous heritage vouchsafed to us from noble sires---we will value this priceless record given now into our hands. It records just a little of the toil and sweat of your loved ones. If you value these things, you will keep current and up-to-date this flexible compilation. Do these things in an orderly manner, as outlined and suggested in the book itself.

Surely we must realize that we are responsible for our own children---to teach them the correct principles of life, salvation and exaltation. We are responsible for our people generally, in-so-far as we ourselves understand the restored Gospel and have opportunity to help in any way. We are responsible for our people on our collateral lines (see page 1,059). As we come to a comprehension of the greatness of the Gospel, we realize that we are our "brother's keeper, our "parents' keeper," our "cousin's keeper" and our "ancestor's keeper"--again in-so-far as we have ability and chance to serve them. Our exaltation is dependant upon our willingness to share.

Should we be inclined to waver, let us remember that our Savior did His Father's bidding and took upon Himself the sins of the whole human race. Can you and I afford to do less than try to help our brother or our cousins and forebears---in ways available to us? And, it seems to work out in the most marvelous way--whenever we truly help others--it ends up in reality helping ourselves, too. It seems to be the greatest paradox in all creation---exemplified by the Savior---being as servants here seems to qualify us as candidates to truly become the Sons and Daughters of God hereafter. Not servants but His divine children with all the blessings of exaltation, eternal life, spiritual offspring and rights to family relationships, association with Jesus--our elder brother and with God, the Father. Others who knowingly ignore this concept and do nothing about it here in mortality---in the hereafter shall be ministering servants or "angels." (Doctrine & Covenants 132:16-17). If we know our Gospel standards----we know these things are true and I here humbly bear solumn testimony to these truths.

My prayer is that we shall all have the courage to accept the fact --that we all have equal responsibility toward our departed. Knowing full well that soon we, too, shall be there. While the day lasts, the sun lighteth us all to do some of these necessary things. Let us this day--this week--this year do what can be done, reasonably, with no excuses. Let us be prepared to meet our Maker--face to face--, and that there shall be few regrets.

Two priceless legacies have come into my possession. First of all it is my good fortune, probably, to know more of our people today than anyone else alive. And secondly, most important of all in my quest---- has come a fuller comprehension of the divine mission of the Son of God. For us both, Esther and I, a testimony of the Christ has become the most real and precious fact in all this world. If I were to say that we have seen Him---I would be telling the truth. In dreams we have seen Him, each at a different time. This is the greatest privilege that could come to us in the flesh. Gladly will we bear our testimonies of this, in person. It is too sacred to attempt to describe in writing. Only this will I say, our Savior is the kindest, most understanding, the most loveable person that we could ever conceive of, and He knows us---yes, everyone.

As a consequence of these things, could we do less, Esther and I, - than try to do our best in publishing the book? We will as long as we have life, try to advance this great latter day work of the redemption and exaltation of our living and our dead. We will bear testimony of Jesus Christ wherever we are, knowing that in so doing we find the deepest joy of all. As we try to serve Him to the best of our abilities, we come to know Him better. To know Him, is to love Him. As we love Him, the warmth of His great love, lifts us to new heights.

Though in this troubled world---help us to remember that "above the clouds the sun is always shining." Give us courage, dear God, to face our futures--unafraid. To do what we must regardless of price or consequence. That we shall have faith in Thee and the solemnity to know - all is well. Give us our daily bread--after it is earned by our toil and sanctify our lives to thy service. That we shall not trod this lonely place alone but by the abundance of Thy goodness, be permitted the companionship of Thy Holy Spirit in all things and to have purpose in our living. Help us to seek not alone for our own sakes but for the well-being and happiness of our fellows. And, in our seeking we have come to know that more likely we will find Thee in the heart of a child, with the lowly of heart and amidst the destitute. Knowing these things---give us courage and strength to stand--firm. Girded about with Thy whole armour prepared finally to be accepted---even at the last day.

User Instructions for the Henson Walker, Jr. Family Record

I took the opportunity to include this record along with the James H. Walker Book on this CD ROM because it is not generally available to most of the younger generation of today. From the CD ROM, this book can be easily duplicated and passed on further now that it is in computer data form. You can only appreciate the dedication and devotion of Floyd A. Walker who published the book in 1963, and the enormity of his task by studying this book. It is truly a master piece of the Walker family history in the early days of Utah in general and Pleasant Grove in particular.

The book presented here is an exact copy of my copy of the original book. It was created by scanning an image of each and every page and putting these pages into two PDF files. One file named “**PREBOOK.PDF**” and the other name “**HWBOOK.PDF**”. The **PREBOOK** file contains pages i to xx of the original book which include general introductory materials, a **Family Index Key**, a **Book Table of Contents**. These user instructions are also included at the end of this **PREBOOK** file. The **HWBOOK** file contains the main body of the Book—all 1241 pages.


It is recommended that you visit the James H. Walker Book first and learn how to use the **Adobe Acrobat Reader**. These instructions are not duplicated here. Because this book was created by an entirely different process, the functions of **Search** and **Find** do not operate in this book. Other important considerations specific to this book are as follows:


1. The key to getting around in this book is the **Book Table of Contents**. This is where the system takes you when you open the **PREBOOK** file—it starts on page 12 and continues to page 21. There are Hyperlink transfer installed these pages which take you to the various sections of the book. Each Hyperlink transfer initiation point is outlined by a **blue box**. Where it will take you is described by the information within the box. You will find Hyperlink transfer initiators on the first page of both the **PREBOOK** file and the **HWBOOK** to take you back to the starting place, namely the first page of the **Book Table of Contents**. Remember from the James H. Walker

Book instructions, clicking on the leftmost arrow of this group, , of icons in the menu bar will take you to the first page of the current file.

2. The **Family Index Key**, which is included on pages 7 to 9 of the **PREBOOK** file, is very helpful in understanding structure of the whole book and in particular the **Book Table of Contents**. The book is organized into sections covering each of Henson Walker, Jr.’s children and grandchildren. The **Family Index Key** tells you what this family structure is and the general order that it is presented in the book. Each section contains three main subsections or

parts—**Biographies**, **PREBOOK**, and **Pictures**. The order in which these three parts are presented varies from family to family, at times intermingled, but they are always there.

3. The pages are all very large (because of their original size of 8.5 by 14 inches.) They are hard to read if you adjust the magnification to get a whole page on your computer screen. You may want to experiment some to find how to best view the pages. I recommend that you start with the following and then adjust according to your personal desires depending on your computer screen size and eye sight. **a.)** Much of the textual material in the book is presented in a two column format—in fact all of the biographies are in this format. I have placed much of this material including all of the biographies under the same tool that is used in the James H. Walker Book for the biographies. This blows up this material on the screen to a size that it is easily readable and takes you automatically from column to column and page to page to be able to read a complete biography without worrying exactly which page or part of a page you have to go to next to continue reading the biography. The details for the use of this tool are provided in the James H. Walker Book user instructions, item 7. Reading biographies. **b.)** Try viewing the Family Group Sheets and the Pictures at 125% magnification. This will almost surely make the pages extend beyond the size of your computer screen. You can use the normal hand tool, , to drag the page around on your screen so you can see its various parts. To drag the page around, hold down you mouse key and move the mouse to drag the page to the desire location.

4. This book has an extensive name index which you can get to from the **Book Table of Contents**, Page 21 of the **PREBOOK** file. You can look up a person and see on which pages he or she can be found in the book. Then you can use the normal **Adobe Acrobat Reader** page navigator to take you to the desire page. (A click on  at the bottom of any page brings up a dialog box where you can enter a page number for immediate movement to that page.) Make sure you read the explanation of the prefix letters used in the name index before trying to use it. You will save yourself a lot of frustration. It is on page 1155 of the book.

In the original book, Floyd included a number of blank pages to encourage people to continue work in a number of areas and add it to the book. I have included these blank pages so that readers will see what Floyd had in mind and also so that the page numbers of the original book and the pages displayed by the **Adobe Acrobat Reader** will correspond exactly. Otherwise the name index would be useless with the book in this form.

You may want to print out these two pages of instructions to help you with viewing the book. In any case when you are finished here click on the box at the top of the previous page to get back to the **Book Table of Contents**, and remember that to return here, click on the “How to use this book.” box at the top of the first page of the **Book Table of Contents**.
